Implementation of Adopt Forest Nijozan -TonenGeneral Goodwill Forest Maintenance Program

TonenGeneral Sekiyu K.K. (head office: Minato-ku, Tokyo; president: Jun Mutoh; "TonenGeneral" herein) implemented its Adopt Forest* Nijozan – TonenGeneral Goodwill Forest Maintenance program on October 1. TonenGeneral has carried out this initiative, the objective of which is the conservation of forests that the owners are no longer able to maintain, in wooded areas along the Nijozan hiking trail in Taishi-cho, located in the Yamada district of Osaka prefecture, since 2011. In addition to cutting down surplus trees, program participants were educated about environmental matters, such as the benefits of forest thinning as a conservation effort (prevention of flooding and landslides, CO2 reduction, etc.). Thirty-four volunteers, including TonenGeneral employees and service station dealers from the Osaka-Hyogo Young Management Kai** took part in the effort.

- * Adopt Forest is a program in which businesses help to maintain forests through activities such as thinning trees and clearing trees and undergrowth in order to help prevent climate change and maintain biological diversity. Osaka prefecture acts as a go-between for forest owners and the businesses that carry out the initiative.
- ** The Osaka-Hyogo Young Management Kai is a sub-unit of the Esso-Mobil-General Kai, a service station dealer organization.
