EM Completes Innovative 40,000L Temporary SS in Rikuzen-Takata

The ExxonMobil Japan Group (head office: Minato-ku, Tokyo; Lead Country Manager: P. P. Ducom) has completed construction of a temporary service station equipped with ISO containers in the city of Rikuzen-Takata, Iwate Prefecture, which suffered extensive damage in the Great East Japan Earthquake.

Drawing on the Group's strength in engineering and fabrication, the innovative service station design utilizes ISO-certified tanks, which are normally used for transporting products such as specialty chemicals. Two tanks, one for gasoline and one for diesel, have been installed at the facility. Each tank has a capacity of 20,000 liters, which in the case of gasoline is enough fuel for 500 passenger vehicles. ExxonMobil Japan Group handed the facility over to the city of Rikuzen-Takata for local oil retailers to operate on a commercial basis starting today (April 22).

The ExxonMobil Japan Group will continue working to support the recovery and restoration of the quake-stricken region by providing this temporary SS design to other towns who need it, and by helping to ensure a stable supply of fuel.
